COURSE DESCRIPTION: Algebra 1A is a two-year course in which the students will take the Algebra 1 Regents examination after successful completion of the two-year program in June of tenth grade. This course will assist students in developing skills and processes to be applied using diverse techniques to successfully solve problems in a variety of settings. Topics will include real number sets, polynomials, linear equations and inequalities, graphing, systems of equations, factoring, and quadratic equations.



Welcome to 9th grade English. We will work on reading and writing skills while engaging in conversations about literature, and exploring our thoughts and ideas through journal writing. Literary elements and vocabulary will be a common thread throughout the year as we read a variety of short stories, informational texts, novels and poems. Students will also write creatively and formally to increase their writing skills, and self expression.

The purpose of the 15:1 setting is to provide individualized instruction, in a small group setting. Our class follows the mainstream curriculum with modifications to the materials, pace of instruction and amount of information covered. Individual Education Plan goals will be addressed through the content of the course. Quarterly progress reports will be emailed home to inform parents/guardians of their child's progress towards reaching their IEP goals.
