



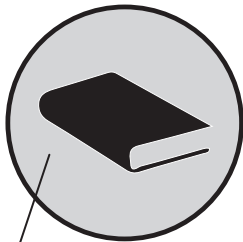

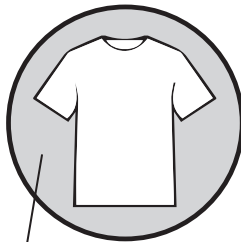
COURSE DESCRIPTION

materials



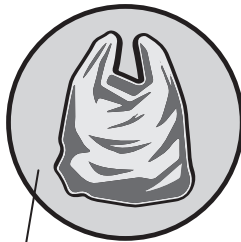
SKETCHBOOK

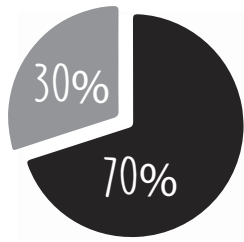

GRADING POLICY



late projects



● **PROJECTS:** 70%

● **CLASS WORK & HOMEWORK:** 30%
homework & class work assignments will not be accepted late



FINAL COURSE GRADE:
each quarter will be worth 50% of the final course grade

Every day a project is late, 10 points will be deducted. If you are absent the day an assignment is due, it is your responsibility to show it to the teacher when you return. If you missed class the day a major project is due, yet were still in school it is your responsibility to find the teacher and turn your project in, or it will be marked late. Students missing a project deadline will have a 'missing' entered as a grade until the project is turned in. If for some reason you feel that you cannot make a deadline, please come speak to the teacher.

ICAMPUS & google classroom

Grades will be regularly posted on the ICampus portal so student progress may be checked throughout the school year. If you notice a mistake on the portal, please contact the teacher immediately. A 'missing' will be entered if the student is not present the day an assignment is due. The missing calculates into the average as a zero until work is submitted. Actual zeros that are entered means the student did not complete the assignment. **HOMEWORK AND CLASS WORK WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED LATE.** If you are absent the day homework or classwork is due, it is your responsibility to show it to the teacher when you return.

We will also be utilizing the google classroom. The access code for the class is on the front of the syllabus. Students will be expected to upload assignments to this site on a regular basis. Class hand outs presentations, and other resources can also be found here as well.
