
COURSE DESCRIPTION

This full year **HONORS LEVEL** course is a continuation of Introduction to Graphic Design. Students will work on real-world projects through the use of the Adobe Creative Suite. Students will explore careers available to artists interested in the communications industry. They will learn to communicate ideas graphically as they work with clients. Students will work to build a college level portfolio. Advertising Practices and Applications is a college level class and students are expected to work at a higher level. For a fee determined by Farmingdale State University, students may receive 3 credits from SUNY Farmingdale. Transcripts may be requested through SUNY Farmingdale. These courses are considered part II and part III of the Ward Melville Advertising Design Academy.



GRADING POLICY





ICAMPIIS classroom

We will be utilizing google classroom. Students will be expected to upload assignments to this site on a regular basis. Class hand outs, presentations, and other resources can also be found here as well.

Grades will be posted on the ICampus portal. Student progress may be checked throughout the school year. If you notice a mistake on the portal, please contact the teacher immediately. A 'missing' will be entered if the student is absent the day an assignment is due. The missing calculates into the average as a zero until work is submitted. Actual zeros that are entered means the student did not complete the assignment. LATE HOMEWORK AND CLASS WORK WILL NOT RECEIVE FULL **CREDIT**. Students have time to complete most classwork during the period. Homeworks are assignments soley done at home. If class work or homework is handed in past the deadline, 50 points will be deducted per day. If you are absent the day work is due, it is your responsibility to show it to the teacher when you return or have it uploaded to google classroom by the deadline.
