Located 50 miles from Manhattan, in the Three Village area, Ward Melville High School is situated in one of the most picturesque and inviting communities on Long Island's North Shore. The presence of Stony Brook University affords the opportunity to participate in a plethora of intellectual and co-curricular activities. The Young Scholars Program at Stony Brook University offers gifted students the opportunity to take college level courses while still in high school. The Bridge Program affords students the opportunity to take college courses at Suffolk County Community College and earn high school course credit as well as college credit.

The areas of Stony Brook, Setauket, and Old Field are home to a culturally diverse population whose residents are frequently employed by Stony Brook University, the Stony Brook Medical Center, and Brookhaven National Laboratory. This internationally represented community is reflected in the High School, granting our students a unique global view of the world in which they live.

ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Ward Melville is a nationally recognized public high school with a current population of 1837 in grades 10-12. More than 96% of the 2013 graduates pursued advanced education. Thirteen (13) Ward Melville seniors were awarded National Merit Finalist status in 2013. Our students have achieved international, national, state, and local recognition for academic, musical, artistic, and athletic endeavors.

ABOUT THE CURRICULUM

Ward Melville High School offers an extensive selection of programs and courses that challenge its student population. Levels of study can vary to meet student needs and include Advanced Placement (AP), Honors, Advanced, and college preparatory courses.
