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COURSE DESCRIPTION

Crafts II is a half year course that introduces students to both 2-D and 3-D design. This course provides an introduction to the basic craft areas of ceramics, mosaics, glass, stencil techniques and sculpture. We may explore several types of media including: clay, glass, natural materials, recycled materials, fiber arts, drawing, and printmaking. It helps satisfy the NYS art/music graduation requirement.

CLASSROOM RULES

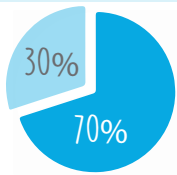
- No food or drink in the room—especially near the computers. **This is a NUT-FREE classroom.**

ICAMPUS, GOOGLE CLASSROOM

Students will be expected to upload assignments to Google Classroom on a regular basis. Class hand outs, presentations, and other resources can be found here as well.

Grades will be posted on the ICampus portal. Student progress may be checked throughout the school year. If you notice a mistake on the portal, please contact the teacher immediately. A 'missing' will be entered if the student is absent the day an assignment is due. The missing calculates into the average as a zero until work is submitted. Actual zeros that are entered means the student did not complete the assignment. **LATE HOMEWORK AND CLASS WORK WILL NOT RECEIVE FULL CREDIT.** Students have time to complete most classwork during the period. Homeworks are assignments solely done at home. If class work or homework is handed in past the deadline, 50 points will be deducted per day. If you are absent the day work is due, it is your responsibility to show it to the teacher when you return or have it uploaded to google classroom by the deadline.

TECHNOLOGY USE

Students are responsible for computer equipment, cameras and other equipment used. They will be held accountable if anything is lost, stolen (without reasonable care on the student's part) or misused in any way. Students are responsible for replacing any equipment that is lost, stolen or broken due to negligence.

LATE PROJECTS

If you are absent the day an assignment is due, it is your responsibility to show it to the teacher when you return or have it uploaded to google classroom. If you missed class the day a major project is due, yet were still in school it is your responsibility to find the teacher and turn your project in, or it will be marked late. Every day a project is late, 10 points will be deducted. Students missing a project deadline will have a 'missing' entered as a grade until the project is turned in. If for some reason you feel that you cannot make a deadline, please come speak to the teacher. This policy does not refer to accepting class work/homeworks late.

If you are a **REMOTE LEARNER**—as the school year progresses, we may have projects or assignments that require specific supplies. If you are unable to obtain these supplies, we will do our best to provide them for you. They must be picked up in a timely manner from the school's main office and items must be returned by the given deadlines as well.
