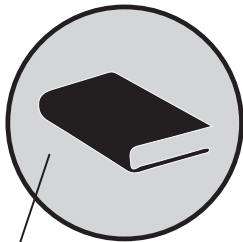

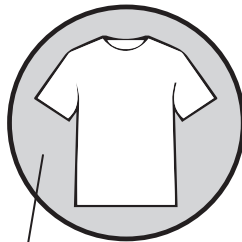
## COURSE DESCRIPTION

Ceramics introduces students to ceramic three-dimensional works of art that are both decorative and functional. Students will learn a variety of hand building techniques, including slab rolled clay, coil and subtractive sculpture. We will also cover wheel throwing: where students will experience loading and unloading and firing a kiln. Various glaze techniques will also be introduced.

## Suggested materials



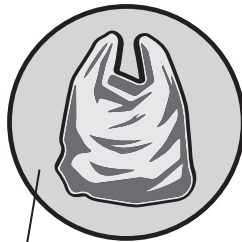
SKETCHBOOK

(or dry cleaning bags—these will be used when we work with clay to keep the clay from drying out)

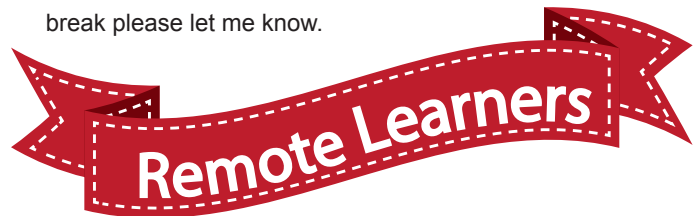

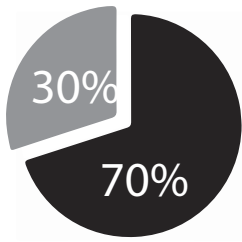


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# GRADING POLICY

## ICampus & google classroom

Actual zeros that are entered means the student did not complete the assignment.
