Mr. McMullen asked the Board about the role of the Budget Advisory Committee and expressed concern that the committee has not yet met.

Ms. Janet VonBargen spoke regarding the Athletic Selection Classification Policy and need for the high school sports programs to remain competitive.

Rose Tant spoke regarding favoritism and the need for fairness in the selection of students for participation in athletics, music, and other extra curricular activities. The Board asked Dr. Lewis to look into the matter and report to them accordingly.

Patty Ewen spoke regarding the process for the selection of students for participation in extra curricular activities and the need for fairness and the need to reach as many children as possible.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to be conducted, it was moved by Mr. Micklos, seconded by Ms. Rudman, and unanimously carried that the meeting be adjourned at 9:45 pm.
