Salutatorian Michael Lu's speech included reflections on the past, making note of the supports the students were provided with, as well as words of encouragement that each could achieve their goals, as long as they were willing to take risks and possess passion to learn.

Valedictorian Ethan Li noted the greatness of the class, and how their path only goes up from here. Ethan Li – Valedictorian, Princeton University

Ethan has maintained a challenging academic schedule throughout his career at Ward Melville, including nine Advanced Placement courses in the areas of science, computer science and mathematics alone. He is a National Advanced Placement Scholar, a national Merit Scholarship Finalist, a 2017 Scholar Chess Player and was named to the All-American Chess Team from 2016-2018.



He is the founder of the Ward Melville Chess Team, a member of the Science Bowl, Math Team and school newspaper. As a dedicated community member, he regularly gives back to the local area as a volunteer chess instructor and as the organizer of Mission: Toothbrush, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that organizes donation drives for various charities and soup kitchens.

Michael Lu – Salutatorian, University of Pennsylvania

Michael has boasted an impressive academic record throughout his academic career. He is highly involved in the district's Science Research Program and was named a Regeneron Science Talent Search Scholar based on his



research on heart health. He was elected the vice president of the school's Chess Team, served as the defense attorney for the building's Mock Trial Team and was named a National Merit finalist. Michael has also been a dedicated volunteer at Mather Hospital.



This year's cohort of Three Village Academy graduates celebrated their collective achievements during a commemorative ceremony at the North Country Administrative Center. Surrounded by proud family members, district staff and friends, the students were applauded for the strides they made that culminated in this event.




Ninth-Graders Move
