## The Results Are In.....Teachers Want More Technology

Last spring, each teacher was sent an internet link asking them to fill out an electronic survey to assess technology needs in the district. In total, we received responses from 392 teachers and here is a summary of some of the results:

- 90.8% of respondents stated that they have adequate access to a computer in their classroom.
- 90.8 also reported that the district provides adequate and timely support for hardware, software and network issues.
- 92% reposnded that technology is an integral part of unit plans and lesson plan preparation.
- 83% of teachers responded that they incorporate digital media in their lessons either always or sometimes. fied, captured and saved through the
- 84% of teachers believe that students are more engaged in learning where technology is present.
- 93% of the teaching staff found that the professional development offered in technology in the district was helpful to them.
- 83% strongly agree or agree that Infinite Campus is easy to use and is a valuable resource in their teaching.

As far as technology equipment items, teachers most requested more computers in their classrooms, as well as, SmartBoards (interactive white boards), tv's and DVD players, and a wireless laptop computer for teacher use.

Teachers most requested further training and instruction on how to evaluate web resources and gain a greater understanding of copyright information. **Moodle** was the most requested software program for further workshops.

# New Technology Arrives in Our Schools Document Cameras Are Here Think 21st Century Overhead Projector...

Document cameras are now available at each of our schools. These devices allow objects to be

placed under the camera and projected onto a large screen. Objects, such as a textbook page, sheet of homework, plant leaf or a map can be viewed as is, magnified, captured and saved through the camera.

The device requires a projector and is generally set up on a mobile, multimedia cart.
